Sponsorship Opportunities for vendors! The Food & Nutrition Management SIAST Advisory Board met on Friday, November 16, 2012 at Kelsey Campus. Representation from all sectors of Food Service Management were in attendance to contribute ideas regarding program change recommendations for upcoming years.

Connie Frith, Program Head reported that they had 11 students graduate in the spring of 2012. Two graduates with full-time employment immediately following graduation, one in Alberta and the other in Meadow Lake, Saskatchewan. There were 3 students working casual in the Saskatoon Health District, 1 working at St Ann's Nursing Home as a casual cook, 1 working in Moose Jaw at a permanent part-time position and 1 working as casual supervisor in Regina.

In response to the accreditation team's recommendation to reduce student workload FNM has deleted JOB 288 Job Search (20 hours), HOSP 182 Introduction to the Hospitality Industry (12 hours), PERS 182 Employability Skills (12 hours) and created a new course Career Development (30 hours). Approval for this change is going forward to the Dean.
